  - d. Mitigation of incoming wildfire to a community through multi-stakeholder projects (10-km community zone) with critical infrastructure values-at-risk, standard, special or hazardous values-at-risk.
  - e. Maintenance of treatment units with previous vegetation management
  - f. Eligible activities recommended in current plans that have not had implementation to date
3. Elements of Successful RFEOI's
  - a. Make a separate application for each FireSmart Discipline (Three updated templates available)
  - b. Clearly identify your expected outcomes
  - c. Project location is clearly identified on a map
  - d. Proponent demonstrates significant support (financial or in-kind) for the proposed work
  - e. Current / on-going projects are nearly complete
  - f. Address all required information requested in the RFEOI Application Form & Template
4. Grant Application Process

- a. Request for Expressions of Interest (RFEI) Due – **September 12, 2022 4pm**
  - b. Request for Proposals (RFP) by invitation. Tentatively due – November 14, 2022
  - c. Project term one-year
  - d. Maximum funding request of \$200,000/community per Application
